These SBUs cut across real estate development, residential homes construction, manufacturing of construction materials, hospitality sector and philanthropy. As the CEO, these SBUs expansion has meant that I have had to trust my team more and more to handle the ever-growing needs and responsibilities.

Since its inception in 1998, Optiven Enterprises, now Optiven Group, has managed to become the industry leader in the real estate sector and over the years it has continued to diversify. BUSINESS MENTORSHIP

In Kenya the **Personal Transformation Talks (PTT)** which began in March to December 2015 at the 680 Hotel in Nairobi and the **Good to Great (G2G)** forums happening at St. Andrews Church Auditorium in Nairobi between March and November 2016. These two programs were helping to steer our youth towards self-employment <https://youtu.be/oQ8NIDekQU8> The same approach was also used to reach out to our young people in the diaspora such as in the United Kingdom.

In my aim to reach more youth I have partnered with various organizations so as to have greater impact. One such organization is Fusion Capital where we have partnered to enable youth from disadvantaged backgrounds to access education. We have over the years adapted UN Sustainable Development Goal number 17 on partnership in order to impact society. It calls for importance of global macroeconomic stability and the need to mobilize financial resources for developing countries from international sources, as well as through strengthened domestic capacities for revenue collection.

Josephine's story is a touching one, especially her early marriage at 13 into a complicated polygamous matrimony involving 9 wives all infected with HIV/Aids. Her story is even more touching; she has also been nursing cancer, yet remains very positive and determined for her sake and that of her 3 children.
